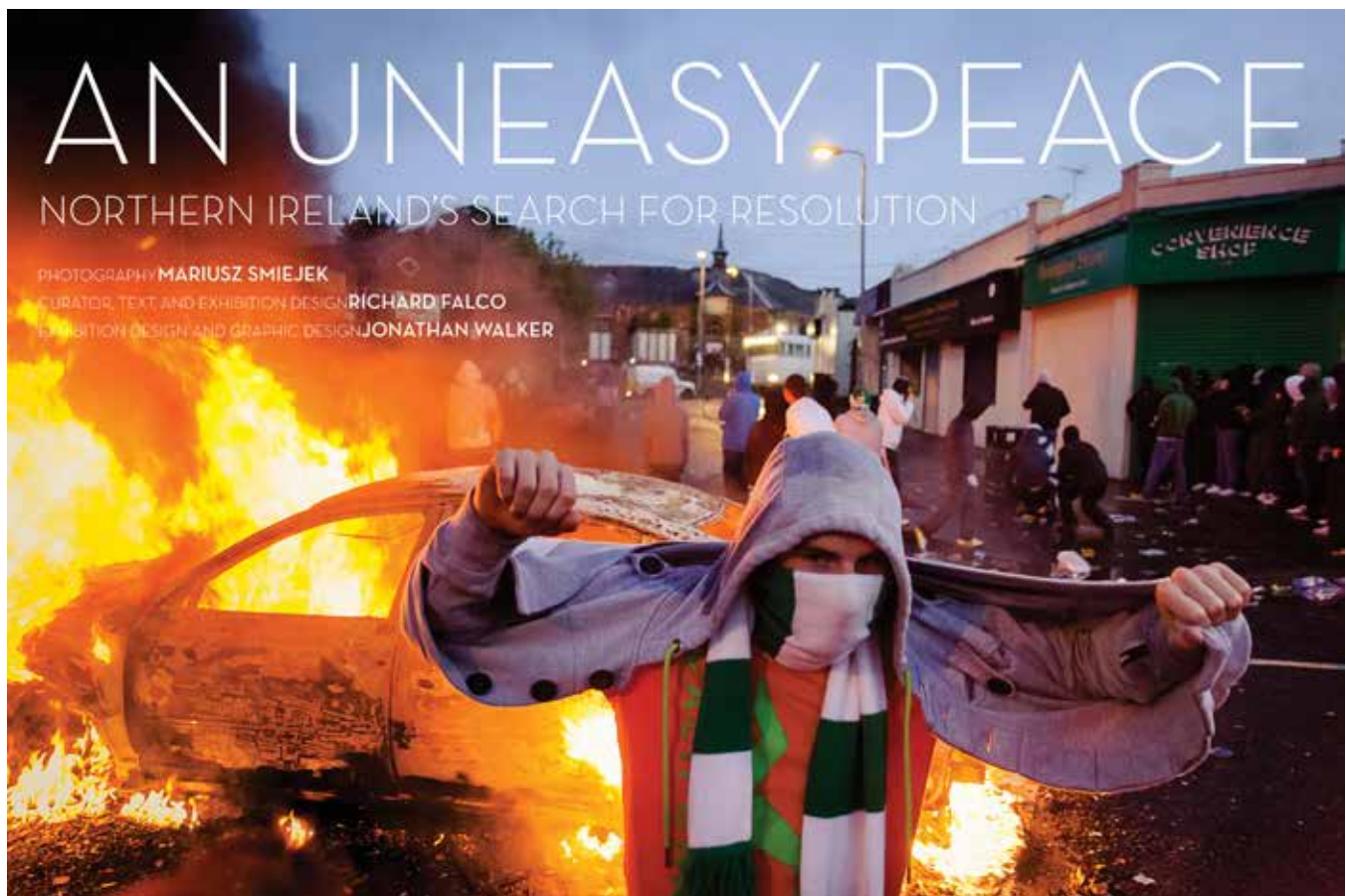

The Good Friday Peace Agreement of 1998 brought a great deal of hope to the residents of Northern Ireland.
